## ◆◆ Diagnosis & Treatment: Bi-Polar Disorder in Childhood "Riding the Roller Coaster"

Its presentation during childhood, however, is typically different from that in adults. Frequently presents a symptoms of other disorders such as ADHD, depression and anxiety. Thus, the condition is very misunderstood, misdiagnosed and mistreated.

## ◆◆ Diagnosis and Treatment of Adolescent Sexual Offenders

Gain understanding of the emotional and environmental triggers which lead to the development of the adolescent sex offenders. Address the typologies of adolescent sex offenders according to the offender's motivation to cross sexual boundaries. Learn the use of denial among sex offenders and effective ways to confront it in both assessment and treatment. Parameters and goals for individual and group psychotherapy (including educational modules) will be addressed as well as goals in family therapy with regards to incest perpetrators in particular. Developmental issues, societal messages regarding youth and sexuality and dysfunctional family dynamics will be addressed. Assess interventions aimed at protecting the community and assisting the offender in learning more appropriate sexual and stress responses. Gain understanding of state of the art treatment methods and modalities in working with these clients. The differences between outpatient, in-home and residential treatments will be addressed and a paradigm for assessing "wellness" will be presented
